





Ceremony between 5<sup>th</sup> September and 10<sup>th</sup> September
2015.

Accordingly, Ground Breaking Ceremony was held on 17th August 2015 where Hon'ble Chief Minister of Punjab, Sardar Prakash Singh Badal graced the occasion. On 7th September 2015, Foundation Stone Laying Ceremony was organized where Hon'ble Union Minister of HRD graced the function in presence of Hon'ble Chief minister of Punjab, Hon'ble Deputy Chief



Processing Industries. Many more dignitaries from Government of Punjab and Central Government attended the function.

An expected expenditure on these two ceremonies was prepared by the University (Annexure-10.3) towards the ceremonies approved by the Competent Authority at a tune of Rs. 15 lacks to be met from Project Account. 
The Finance Committee resolved to ratify the purchase.

The Hostel accommodation available on City Campus was limited and as per the approval of EC, the additionalThe university has taken on rent the hostel of University College, Ghudda (Punjabi University, Patiala) on temporary basis on a monthly rent of Rs. 1,88,500/-. The accommodation was used for a month.

Keeping in view the overwhelming response for admissions to its Post Graduate and Research programs from different parts of the country during session 2015-16 and shortfall of more than 100 seats for the boys, the university approached the Punjabi University authorities through local administration.

Finance Committee resolved to ratify the expenditure of Rs. 1,88,500/-.






