The Central University of Punjab is celebrating its fifth anniversary in February, 2014. The newsletter is indicative of the university's allround development and progress in academics, research, infrastructure and other convergent areas such as celebration of the culture of the region, eradication of social and environmental maladies and involvement with the region at grassroot levels.

The university made a modest beginning in 2009, and went on to initiate M.Phil.-Ph.D. Integrated Programme in four streams. The university provides all the necessary facilities of any institution of higher learning including a state of the art Computer Centre, Fitness Centre, well-endowed Library, various research and teaching laboratories for different centres and Central Instrumentation Facility with Atomic Absorption Spectrometer, Gas Chromatography Mass Specrometer, Confocal Laser Scanning and Field Emission Scanning Electron Microscopes used across the centres.

The university has attracted faculty from 12 states and students from 16 different states of India. The faculty of the university published 169 research papers since its establishment in 2009 with a cumulative impact factor of 159.27. The university has attained the highest rank in terms of *h*-index and citation index among the newly established central universities. Several eminent scholars from diverse fields are frequently invited to deliver lectures and interact with the faculty and students.

The university has been able to achieve the objectives proposed by the planning forums and statutory committees of the university, but a multidimensional effort requires to be put in to achieve designated long-term goals. The commencement of several new courses in the coming years is being planned such as M.Sc. in Human Genetics, Bioinformatics, and Genetic Diseases and Molecular Medicine, M.A. in Education and M.Ed.

I have a firm belief that the university will continue to make unprecedented advances in all these fields and will go on to become an institution of international repute.






