18th Meeting of the Academic Council

"Ashtaadashi"(18 Projects) for sustaining the growth of Sanskrit for the year 2016-17.

It was informed that the University has no Evening School running at present, a Standing Committee comprising the following was constituted to review the projects to be submitted to funding agencies:

- 1. Dean Academic Affairs
- 2. Registrar
- 3. Dean Student Welfare
- 4. Proposers
- 5. Assistant Registrar (Finance) Convener

Further, a meeting of the Standing Committee for review of project proposals was held on 12th February 2018. The committee discussed the proposal of Evening School Project submitted by Dr. Zameerpal Kaur and Dr. Rajinder Kumar of Department of Language and Comparative Literature. The committee was of the opinion that starting of evening school is a policy decision and should have concurrence of Statutory Bodies before it is started. Hence committee recommended that the project may be put for consideration of Academic Council and Executive Council.

The Secretary also informed that the Executive Council considered the same in its 29th meeting held on 7th May 2018 vide Item.No:EC:29:2018:22 and resolved to approve starting of Evening School under project, subject to recommendations of the Academic Council, at no cost to the University except the logistic support.

RESOLVE:

The Academic Council, after deliberations, unanimously RESOLVED to ratify the decision of to the Executive Council to approve in principle the starting of Evening classes under the project as stated above.

The Academic Council FURTHER RESOLVED that the University may start the Evening classes only after detailed deliberations on syllabus and others details of the proposed project and the details be brought back to the Academic Council for consideration.

- b) The Course Codes should be uniform for same course. These are to be verified and finalized by the Controller of Examination, for each programme.
- c) The Departments should encourage Project Reports of limited scope in PG programme, keeping in mind the fund restraints and availability of chemicals and equipments.
- d) In addition to introducing basic research through a project review, last semester may be used to supplement the NET syllabus preparations mock tests/rehearsal tests etc.
- e) The Electives must be offered in every semester and in each semester there should be enough (at least 2) options for the students to choose from.

A meeting of Board of Studies of Department of Biochemistry and Microbial Sciences was held on 16 May, 2018 at 11:00 am in the committee room (Academic Block), CUPB.

The agenda of the meeting is as given below:

- 1. To review and approve the proposed changes, course structure and syllabus for M.Sc. Life Sciences with specialization in Biochemistry based on CBCS and IQAC recommendations for academic session 2018-19.
- 2. To review and approve the proposed changes, course structure and syllabus for M.Sc. Life Sciences with specialization in Microbial Sciences based on CBCS and IQAC recommendations for academic session 2018-19.

The agenda items which were placed before the BoS and following changes has been incorporated in various courses:

Item no. I. Changes common to both M.Sc. Life Sciences with specialization in Biochemistry and Specialisation Microbial Sciences for academic session 2018-19.

1. Addition of "Value based courses or MOOCs" courses of 1 credit in first semester and fourth semester as elective foundation courses.

2. In second semester another **Compulsory Foundation** course of 4 credits is added which the students will choose from "MOOCs".

3. For the preparation of national level competitive examinations, Discipline Enrichment Course-I and Discipline Enrichment Course-II of 2 credits each is offered in third and fourth semester respectively.

4. The research project will be of 4 and 8 credits each in third and fourth semester, respectively.

5. Discipline elective course of Cell Culture Techniques (LBC. 561/LMS 561) is added in IIIrd semester. Another Discipline elective course of Clinical Diagnostics (LBC. 581/LMS. 581) is added in IVth semester.

Item no. II. Changes in M.Sc. Life Sciences with specialization in Biochemistry for academic session 2018-19.

1. Clinical Biochemistry (3 credits, LBC.552) and Nutritional Biochemistry (2 credits, LBC 572) has been merged as Clinical and Nutritional Biochemistry course of 3 credits in IIIrd semester.

Item no. III. Changes in M.Sc. Life Sciences with specialization in Microbial Sciences for academic session 2018-19.

- Virology (3 credits, LMS.553) from IIIrd semester has been removed and its contents are added in Microbiology and Clinical Microbiology (a credits, LMS.524).
- 2. In IIIrd semester for the students to relate the theoretical knowledge to practical aspects of the studied courses such as Industrial and Environmental Microbiology (LMS.551) & Food and Dairy Microbiology (LMS.552) an industrial visit/tour has been added under mode of classroom Transaction.

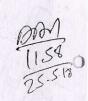

- 2. To discuss about complete/partial adoption of Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) recommended curriculum, syllabi and examination pattern for M. Pharm. courses.

The BoS discussed and unanimously resolved that all the syllabi have been finalized keeping in consideration of IQAC (Annexure 1) /PCI (Annexure II) guidelines related to CBCS and others. After thorough discussion, the BOS recommended as under:

Agenda Item No.1: To revise the syllabi of M.Sc. course according to latest IQAC guidelines for the session 2018 – 2019.

- Resolution:
- The courses in the syllabus are re-classified as per the instructions of IQAC, CUPB.
- Course codes have been kept as it is as per university Examination guidelines.
- Advanced Spectral Analysis (CMC.526), has been added in Semester II.
- The course (CMC.505) (Semester 1) has been revised to include spectrofluorimetry, flame emission spectroscopy, atomic absorption spectroscopy, electrophoresis, X-ray crystallography, Immunological assays, potentiometric and thermal techniques.
- Research Methodology (CMC.502) has been added in semester III.

- Skill based elective courses (14 Cr.) were kept in Semester-II and Semester IV. These include: Credit Seminar-I (1 Cr.), Project Work (12 Cr.) and Credit Seminar-II (Presentation Skills; 1 Cr.).
- A 4 credit elective MOOC course has been added in Semester-IV.
- Elective Foundation/Value based courses (1 Cr. each) were introduced in Semester-II and Semester-III.
- Total credit for Project Work has now been reduced from 20 Cr. to 12 Cr. in Sem-IV.

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- DEC-I and DEC-II courses (2 Cr. Each) are included in semester- III and IV. DE is to enrich student domain/knowledge which will help them in employment.
- The curriculum has been designed by keeping in view of the syllabi of Institutes/Universities of National and International repute and may be utilized for various competitive exams as well as it will enhance employability of the students in academia as well as industry.

Item No. 2: To discuss about complete/partial adoption of PCI recommended curriculum, syllabi and examination pattern for M.Pharm. courses.

Resolution: IOAC of CUPB issued the guidelines (Annexure-I) for masters' programs and recommended that those courses which are being regulated by National Regulatory Bodies need to follow their guidelines and requirements w.r.t curriculum and credits. M.Pharm. programs are being regulated at National level by Pharmacy Council of India (PCI). PCI has recommended syllabi and prescribed curriculum, credits, course codes, examination/evaluation pattern for M.Pharm. courses (Annexure II) vide Gazette of India No. 362, dated June 1, 2017. PCI through notification Ref no. 14-136/2016-PCI/13921-15179 (Annexure III) instructed all the universities and colleges to comply with the prescribed curriculum, credits, course codes, syllabi and examination/evaluation pattern for M.Pharm. courses failing which approval of the courses may be cancelled. Further, committee went through the syllabi of M. Pharm courses run by some institutions such as UIPS, Panjab University, Chandigarh, Delhi Pharmaceutical Sciences and Research University (DPSRU) Delhi, Guru Nanak Dev University (GNDU), Maharaja Ranjit Singh Punjab Technical University (MRSPTU) and found that these institutions were syllabi and the curriculum, credits, course codes, following examination/evaluation pattern for M.Pharm. courses 100% as prescribed by PCI. The committee was informed about the recent PCI inspection held for the approval of M.Pharm. courses in Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy and Phytochemistry. The PCI final decision on the approved intake is under process. Keeping in view of the above, committee recommends that curriculum, credits, course codes, syllabi and examination/evaluation pattern may be adopted as such prescribed by PCI for M.Pharm. courses (copy enclosed, Annexure IV) w.e.f batch 2018-19 onwards. However apart from PCI compliance, few additional courses pertaining to Pharma Industry perspectives may be introduced so as to

expose students to current trends in research and development of pharmaceuticals.

The suggested courses are as under:

- 1. Pharmacological screening and Regulatory toxicology of 4 credits to be offered in Semester-III.
- 2. ID courses of 2 credits related to Environmental Sciences to be taken in semester -1, offered by EVST department.
- 3. Another ID course, 2-credits related to Safety (Chemical, Biological and Radiation) to be offered in Semester II and the course content may be adopted from NIPER, SAS Nagar.
- 4. In course, Modern Pharmaceutical Analytical Techniques, BOS recommends to include following topics:
- i) Pharmaceutical Quality by design, qualitative and quantitative analysis of drugs and pharmaceuticals including impurity profiling in Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients (APIs) as per regulatory requirements, ICH guidelines for analysis of drugs and pharmaceuticals.

Item No. 3: Any other, if required.

BOS recommends:

- a) To initiate MOU with Government aided research institutes and pharma industry.
- b) To formulate guidelines for industry sponsored projects to PhD. students and summer/winter training to M.Sc./M.Pharm students
- c) Visit to Pharma Industry/Public Research Institutes so as to get exposure to recent trends in Pharmaceuticals.

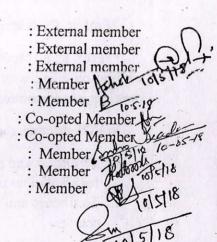

NOTIFICATION

In pursuance to Item No. EC:11:2014:13 of the Minutes of the 11th Meeting of Executive Council of Central University of Punjab, approval of the Executive Council is hereby conveyed to the recommendations of the Academic Council (as recommended in its 5th meeting) for grant of Professional Leave in favour of the faculty members to attend orientation/refresher course(s) as detailed below:

1) General Rules Relating to Leave:

- a. No teacher can claim leave as a matter of right and when the exigencies or service so demand, leave of any description may be refused or revoked by the leave sanctioning authority.
- b. In case a teacher is recalled to duty before the expiry of his leave, such recall to duty shall be treated as binding and compulsory in all cases.
- c. Except as otherwise provided in these rules, leave shall be earned by period spent on duty only.
- d. No teacher shall avail leave of any kind, except in case of emergency or for reasons beyond his/her control, unless the leave has been sanctioned by the competent authority. Provided further that application for leave must reach the competent authority in advance giving sufficient time to grant or deny the leave.
- e. As a general rule, the Professional leave can be availed from the commencement of the academic session and no teacher would be permitted to proceed on long leave while the academic session is in progress and continuing.

2) Professional Leave:

- a) A whole time permanent teacher may be granted Professional Leave of such duration as may be considered nooossury by the sanctioning authority for career progression as per UGC guidelines.
 - 1. Attending the orientation/Refreshers' Course of the national level bodies on behalf of the University or with the permission of the University.
- b) Professional Leave may be granted on full pay without any other financial compensation.
- c) Professional Leave will not be combined with any other leave except medical leave.

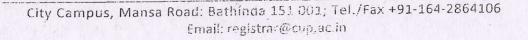
