IP sharing <p>The Innovation/Entrepreneurship Policy of some other Central or State universities can be taken into consideration and after getting some necessary modifications NISP policy can adopted in the University (<u>Annexure-32.11</u>).</p> <p>2. Ideation and Prototype leading to Start-up:</p> <p>The Department of Applied Agriculture (Food Science & Technology) and Computer Science and Technology have submitted a proposal that the students of these departments need to be motivated to run their own start-ups. In these disciplines, if student(s) has some business idea or Proof of Concept that which has potential to become prototype leading to start-up, such student(s) may be allowed to opt this <i>in lieu</i> of Dissertation in PG Programs.</p> <p>The Incubation Centre of the University and respective faculty supervisor jointly may mentor such students. The stakes or claim of ownership in intellectual property developed during this time will be as per the National Innovation and Start-up Policy of the University. After due deliberations, it recommended that the honorarium payable to external experts in India for thesis evaluation may be increased to Rs. 4,000/-, while the honorarium for experts from abroad shall remain unchanged at US \$130.
