**Minutes of the
30th Meeting of the Finance Committee**

The 30th Meeting of the Finance Committee of the Central University of Punjab, was held on 14th August 2023 (11:30 a.m.) in online Mode.

Venue: Conference Room, Aryabhata Academic Block, Adjacent Vice-Chancellor’s Office, Ghudda.

The list of the members present during the meeting is annexed.

The Chairperson formally welcomed the members of the Finance Committee and thanked them for sparing their valuable time from their busy schedule to attend the 30th meeting of the Finance Committee for making it possible to attend this meeting in online mode. Thereafter, the Chairperson introduced and welcomed newly nominated members to the Finance Committee, namely Prof. Tankeshwar Kumar, Prof. K.R.S. Sambasiva Rao and Shri R.D. Sahay.

Afterwards, the Vice-Chancellor gave a presentation on the progress made by the university in respect of academics, research and infrastructural developments since its previous meeting held on 07th June 2023, in online mode in furtherance of the vision and mission of the University. The members applauded the University for the significant contribution made during the intervening period.

<u>Item.No:FC:30:2023:3</u> To consider and approve the preliminary estimate: a) for construction of 400 seater Girls and 600 seater Boys hostel Central University of Punjab as submitted by CPWD. b) for construction of Academic Block at Central University of Punjab as submitted by CPWD.	<u>AGENDA NOTE:</u> The Building committee in its 53 rd meeting resolved to approve the proposal of the University for construction of 02 new hostels (400 seater girls and 600 seater boys). Accordingly, University vide its letter no. CUPB/CC/ES/22-23/426 dated 05.01.2023 requested CPWD to provide the preliminary estimates for the proposed 400 seater girls hostel and 600 seater boys hostel to be constructed in the campus of Central University of Punjab. CPWD vide its letter no.: 24(22)/CU/LD/JC/2023/744 dated 11.07.2023 submitted the estimates amounting to Rs. 35,08,86,500/- and Rs.52,56,41,500/- respectively for the above works. The Preliminary estimates based on PAR 2021 as submitted by CPWD are enclosed as <i>Annexure 30.2 & Annexure-30.3.</i> With the increase in the no. of departments and student strength, the University felt a requirement to construct One Academic Block separately for Humanities and Social Science Departments. Accordingly, the University evaluated the requirements and bifurcation of area for the construction of new Academic Block (<i>Annexure-30.4</i>). The University vide its letter no. CUPB/CC/ES/23-24/11 dated 13.04.2023 requested CPWD to provide the preliminary estimate for the proposed new Academic Block. CPWD vide letter No.: 24(22)/CU/LD/JC/2023/752 dated 12.07.2023 submitted the estimates amounting to Rs. 102,34,49,900/-. The Preliminary estimates based on PAR 2021 as submitted by CPWD are enclosed as <i>Annexure-30.5.</i> The preliminary estimate of above works as submitted by CPWD were submitted to the Building Committee in circulation for consideration and approval vide e-mail dated 20.07.2023, which was approved by the members of Building Committee by return e-mail.
