First Annual English Literature Festival on the theme of The Magical World of Harry Potter

Prof. Raghavendra P. Tiwari, the Vice-Chancellor, CUPB and Dr. Girish Pawar from the University of Hyderabad were the chief guest and the speaker of the day, respectively.
