<u>Item.No:AC:30:2025:3</u> To ratify the approval of the University as per recommendations of the Committee constituted for issuing Provisional Degree Certificate to Ms. Gali Nikky Bhedi, 2019 batch M.Pharm. student.	<u>AGENDA NOTE:</u> <p>Ms. Gali Nikky Bhedi, a 2019 batch student of M.Pharm. Pharmaceutical Sciences (Medicinal Chemistry) vide her email dated 5.11.2024 requested the university to issue her provisional degree certificate. In response, the university informed her that she has already completed the maximum duration of completing the degree, as she was required to complete the degree till June 2023, as per the Clause No. 2.1 & 2.2 of University rules (applicable w.e.f. Academic Session 2021-22).</p> <p>Further, Ms. Nikky vide her email dated 10.12.2024 has again requested for Provisional Certificate, considering the provision of National Education Policy 2020.</p> <p>Subsequently, a Committee was constituted to look into the request of Ms. Nikky regarding issuing of Provisional Certificate taking into account her exceptional circumstances.</p> <p>The Committee deliberated on the matter and keeping in view of the career and the future of the student, the committee recommends the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. As the year 2020-2021 is having COVID pandemic, the committee recommends her case on the humanitarian grounds. 2. As per the Master's rules 2017-18 clause No. 20.1POWER TO REMOVE ANY DIFFICULTY, states that, notwithstanding what is contained in the Rules, the Chairperson, Academic Council/Executive Council may in exceptional circumstances and on the recommendations of the School Board concerned or an appropriate Committee on the merits of each individual with reasons to be recorded, allow relaxation of any of the provisions except those prescribing CGPA requirement & the Clause 19.3. 3. Exemption may be provided to the student to complete the degree as per NEP-2020. 4. Post-approval of the MOOC subject (i.e. Basics of Health Promotion and Education Interventions) in lieu of IDC paper (MOOC) of 1st semester for completion of the degree, which she has passed after 5 years in the month of September 2024. 5. Student may be asked to deposit fee/charges/fine of Rs.5000/- for exceptional mercy opportunity. <p>The Vice-Chancellor, being Chairman of the Academic Council has approved the recommendations of the Committee.</p>

SWAYAM and SWAYAM Plus is enclosed as <i>Annexure-30.8</i>, detailing various features of these two platforms including four quadrants, registration, explanation of APAAR, NAD, ABC, NCrF, Assessments, guidelines to develop a SWAYAM course, roadmap, and best practices etc.</p> <p>A. SWAYAM guidelines are part of the booklet. Some key points are as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. One PG level SWAYAM course is a mandatory requirement of all Post Graduate courses in the university except professional programs where SWAYAM is not required. This SWAYAM course can



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	<p>be taken during any semester of their 4th semester PG program, preferably in the first 3rd semesters. The course can be taken in lieu of IDC or VAC courses in consultation with HoD or SWAYAM Coordinator of the department. In case the department recommends, SWAYAM can also be taken in lieu of Core Courses/Discipline Elective Courses, for which 70% syllabus content cross-matching is required</p> <p>b. In case of failure in SWAYAM or SWAYAM Plus courses, students can register for the same or another course in next offering after consultation with departmental SWAYAM coordinator/HoD. Alternatively, if the department wish to do so, an internal examination can be conducted for the SWAYAM course at the university level as per UGC Framework D.O.F. No. 1-8/2017 (SWAYAM) dated 27th August 2024. In cases where students reappear in another SWAYAM course or via university level course, HoD has to forward the result to CoE and CoE to ensure that results are updated in the results portal.</p> <p>B. SWAYAM Plus guidelines:</p> <p>a. In addition to the mandatory SWAYAM requirement, one SWAYAM Plus course that has certification is also recommended for all students, including UG, PG and PhD. As SWAYAM Plus courses are offered in collaboration with industries like Tech Mahindra, L&T, Infosys, Microsoft, Google etc., these courses substantially increase the employability of the students.</p> <p>The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.</p>

The committee was constituted to consider the request of the Chair Professor. The minutes of the meeting are placed at <i>Annexure – 30.13</i> . The important part of the minutes is reproduced below: <i>..... In view of the UGC guidelines and the scheme for creating Dr. Ambedkar Chairs by Dr. Ambedkar Foundation, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India, the committee recommends that the matter be referred to UGC for clarification whether the Chair Professor and Assistant Professor under Dr. Ambedkar shall serve as supervisor of Ph.D. students. The committee also recommends that the students admitted in the Ph.D. program on Ambedkar Culture and Leadership may complete coursework and notification of supervisor allocation kept on hold. However, the Chair Professor may provide guidance to the Ph.D. students in the interim period. Further, the matter may be put up to Academic Council for discussion and resolution.</i> The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.
<u>RESOLVE</u>	The Council after detailed discussions unanimously resolved to approve that Prof. Kanhaiya Tripathi, Chair Professor, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Chair be allowed to serve as supervisor to PhD students already enrolled in Ambedkar Culture and Leadership programme, along with one co-guide who must be regular faculty. Further, the Council noted that the Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Chair was established in year 2023 (for five years) and is about to complete two years of its establishment in the University.
